Blessings on the great feast of our Lord's Theophany *(transferred from January 6th)* *(manifestation or revelation at His Baptism)!*

Welcome to St. George! Thank you for attending today's Divine Services. If you are a first-time visitor, please register your visit by completing the guest book located in the narthex. We would appreciate getting to meet you after liturgy, so feel free to join us during Coffee Fellowship! Every Sunday we remember the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The word "*Liturgy*" means *work of the people* that means everyone participates through singing, praying, hearing the teaching, and opening our hearts to allow God's grace to enter. Anyone interested in learning more about our faith are encouraged to speak with one of our clergy.

Guidelines for Receiving Holy Communion for Orthodox Christians: Orthodox Christians fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist by receiving Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's command *to eat His Body and drink His Blood*. In order to be properly prepared to receive Holy Communion, the faithful should fast (no food or drink from midnight the night before), the Sacrament of Confession (7 years and older) within the last 2 months, being at peace with others, and striving to always love God and their neighbor. Frequent communion and regular confession are recommended for all faithful Orthodox Christians.

For other Christians: We welcome you to this celebration of the Divine Liturgy. Unfortunately, we cannot extend to you a general invitation to receive Holy Communion. Orthodox Christians believe that the Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of our community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, but for which we must all pray. All, however, are welcome to partake of the blessed bread (*antidoron*) which will be given when coming forward to venerate (kiss) the Holy Cross and receive the final blessing from the priest. Again, welcome!

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Today's special **ZALABEE (FRIED DOUGH) COFFEE FELLOWSHIP** is hosted by *our Altar Society*. They are taking donations to help in their ministry of decorating the church throughout the year ... please be generous!

Why *Zalabee* (or *Zalabia*) for Theophany? There are two reasons: #1 relates to the manner in which it was originally leavened. In olden days, the dough was prepared without yeast. Instead the dough was wrapped in cloth which was then tied into a bag, dipped three times in water ("baptized") and then suspended from the limb of a tree until it doubled in size (the water acted with enzymes to create a natural leavening); and #2 relates to the manner in which it is cooked. Rather than being baked, it is deep-fried by being submerged ("baptized") in hot oil.

St. Paul taught in 1 Timothy 3:15, “*the Church is the pillar and ground of Truth*”, and it is to this Church that the Apostles entrusted the Faith, once and for all delivered to the saints as its guardians and protectors (Jude 1:3). Thus, the Church’s services, prayers, Liturgies, and sacraments are all essential if we are to be authentic as people of faith.

“In accordance with the Apostolic Faith delivered to us by tradition from the Fathers, I have delivered the tradition, without inventing anything extraneous to it. What I have learned, that I inscribed, comfortably with the Holy Scriptures” (Saint Athanasios the Great, Archbishop of Alexandria, 297-373AD).

It is through this Tradition that we bind ourselves to Christ, serving only Him. All else must be secondary. When the Lord says “*You cannot serve God and mammon,*” He is referring to things of a materialistic nature (mammon is the Aramaic word for “god of wealth” i.e. money). He asks us all to declare whom we serve, God or mammon?

The way to determine who or what we love the most is to see where our loyalties lie. When we are faced with choices between God, and anything else, what will be our choice? Do we choose to attend church on Sunday or do we choose to sleep in or find something else to do? Do we prioritize our life around our relationship with God, or do sporting events, vacations, family outings, entertainment, or friends take center stage? Does prayer, reading the bible, serving others, financially supporting the church and its mission, and giving alms for the poor serve as our central theme, or do we choose personal gain and pleasure as central to our life?

It is my heart’s desire to greet all of you as we begin the year 2024, with the words, “*Glory to Jesus Christ, Glory Forever*”. May this year be one of spiritual renewal for all of us, and may we use the time God gives us profitably, and for His glory. Let us love one another, and remember to pray for each other. Let us pray for the world, peace, and the salvation of all. May the Light of Christ shine brightly in us, that the world may know the love of God, and see God’s mercy and kindness in us.
