Welcome to St. George! Thank you for attending today's Divine Services. If you are a first-time visitor, please register your visit by completing the guest book located in the narthex. We would appreciate getting to meet you after liturgy, so feel free to join us during Coffee Fellowship! Every Sunday we remember the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The word "Liturgy" means work of the people that means everyone participates through singing, praying, hearing the teaching, and opening our hearts to allow God's grace to enter. Anyone interested in learning more about our faith are encouraged to speak with one of our clergy.

Guidelines for Receiving Holy Communion for Orthodox Christians: Orthodox Christians fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist by receiving Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's command to eat His Body and drink His Blood. In order to be properly prepared to receive Holy Communion, the faithful should fast (no food or drink from midnight the night before), the Sacrament of Confession (7 years and older) within the last 2 months, being at peace with others, and striving to always love God and their neighbor. Frequent communion and regular confession are recommended for all faithful Orthodox Christians.

For other Christians: We welcome you to this celebration of the Divine Liturgy. Unfortunately, we cannot extend to you a general invitation to receive Holy Communion. Orthodox Christians believe that the Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of our community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, but for which we must all pray. All, however, are welcome to partake of the blessed bread (antidoron) which will be given when coming forward to venerate (kiss) the Holy Cross and receive the final blessing from the priest. Again, welcome!

COMING EVENTS

Fasting Discipline On Wednesday, November 15th, we began the traditional forty-day **Nativity Fast** (also called the Christmas or Advent Fast) in preparation for the **Nativity of Christ** on December 25th. The Fast is divided into two periods. The <u>first period</u> is until December 19th when the traditional fasting discipline (no meat, poultry, eggs, dairy, fish, wine, oil and their by-products) is observed on all days except Tuesdays and Thursdays when wine and oil are allowed and Saturdays and Sundays when fish, wine, and oil are allowed. There is no fasting on Thanksgiving Day.

Giving Thanks ~ Remembering to Give Thanks, Frequently!

by Abbot Tryphon, head of All-Merciful Savior Monastery on Vashon Island, Washington "We thank thee, O Christ our God, that thou hast satisfied us with thy earthly gifts, deprive us not of thy Heavenly Kingdom; but as thou entered into the midst of thy disciples, O Savior, and gave them peace, enter also among us and save us. Amen."

This prayer is one of my personal favorites, for it recognizes in concise words my need to remember to give thanks to God for all He has given me. It connects me to the ancient Church, for it allows me to recount the Lord's coming in the midst of His disciples, and granting them the peace I so desire. It keeps me focused on the goal, and remembering, throughout my day, that the Lord is to be my focus.

This is the prayer many Orthodox Christians pray at the end of meals, yet also a prayer that can be offered whenever we are feeling a certain gratefulness of heart, or desiring God's loving mercy.

Prayers like this are easily memorized, allowing us to express our gratitude to God without being wordy. The Lord knows our needs, and there is no need to "spell it out" for God. What is necessary is that we remember to give thanks to God, and let the Lord hear from us throughout the day. Such short little prayers are perfect for keeping ourselves spiritually focused because they express our desire to make communion with God the central part of our day.

This is a wonderful prayer to say with children just before tucking them in for the night, ending their waking hours by calling down God's peace into their hearts. It is a wonderful prayer to offer as we've arrived safely to our destination, following the morning commute.

Our prayers need not be long, but they should be frequent. Just as an old couple who've shared a long life together don't need to say a lot of words in order to demonstrate their love for one another, so too, our prayers don't need to be long and formal in order to let God know we love Him, but they do need to be frequent.



A prayer before your Thanksgiving meals

O God, Who at all times and in every hour, in heaven and on earth, is worshipped and glorified; Who is long suffering, merciful, and compassionate, and Who loves the just and shows mercy upon the sinner, on this special day of Thanksgiving, we bow our heads in prayer and pray for peace in this troubled world. For it is only Your Peace, the Prince of Peace, Your son Jesus Christ, that has the power to sustain us and the whole world. O Lord of Hosts; do not abandon Your humanity and do not forsake us, Your children. In Your eyes, O Lord, all creation is the work of Your hand, and we are all counted together as your Holy children. We pray for our nation and that Your peace will reign over us. We ask that you remember our loved ones who have passed into everlasting life. No matter how many times we thank You for Your blessings and gifts, unworthy recipients that we are, we cannot thank You enough, but humbly ask You to bless the food and drink which have been prepared for us so we can always give thanks to the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen.
