Fasting Discipline On Tuesday, November 15th, we began the traditional forty-day Nativity Fast in preparation for the Nativity of Christ on December 25th. The Fast is divided into two periods. The first period is until December 19th when the traditional fasting discipline (no meat, poultry, eggs, dairy, fish, wine, oil and their by-products) is observed on all days except Tuesdays and Thursdays when wine and oil are allowed and Saturdays and Sundays when fish, wine, and oil are allowed. The 2nd period is from December 20th through 24th, when the traditional fasting discipline (no meat, poultry, eggs, dairy, fish, wine, oil and their by-products) is observed except on Saturday and Sunday when wine and oil are permitted. There is no fasting from Christmas Day December 25th until January 4th.

The Incarnation ~ God Himself Has Appeared in the Flesh

We Orthodox Christians who keep the old Church Calendar are celebrating the Nativity of Christ Our Lord on January 7th. The new calendar churches celebrate on December 25th. On this day, we gather together in monasteries, chapels, churches, and cathedrals, to celebrate the Liturgy of the Nativity of Our Lord, God, and Savior, Jesus Christ. The very incarnation *(one who puts on flesh)* of the Son of God and His coming into the world is singularly one of the greatest events in the history of humankind. That God Himself would take on our image, and join His Divinity to our humanity, is one of the great mysteries of our faith.

A Virgin, who by her humility was obedient to the will of God, agreeing to become a living tabernacle of the very God who created her, and who by her obedience became the first disciple of the Lord, and the New Eve, ushered in our salvation.

By His condescension, salvation entered our world, and the power of death was overcome. The very Word of God, by Whom the whole of the cosmos came into being, became a little child, born of a woman. At that moment the demons trembled, knowing they already lost their battle, and their rebellion against God had seen its end.

Let us prepare ourselves for the reception of the Holy Mysteries, that as we partake in the Body and Blood of Our Lord during the Nativity Liturgy, we may give birth, anew, to Christ in our hearts. Let us be reborn in the spirit, transformed and made whole by the living God of Lights. Together with the angels, and all the heavenly hosts, let us sing:

Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts, heaven and earth are filled with Thy glory!

Get your bibles, find the New Testament, and then the 1st book which is the Gospel of St. Matthew. Find chapter 1, and start reading at verse 18 and continue until the end of chapter 2. Here you will read about the Nativity (Birth) our Lord Jesus Christ. The how, when, and where things happened. It's beautiful and it's the beginning of our salvation!

If you want to learn more about our Lord becoming like one of us when He put on flesh, go to the 3rd book in the New Testament with is the Gospel of St. Luke. Find chapter 2 and read the whole chapter. Here we learn why Mary and Joseph were in Bethleham, about the shepherds in the fields (later called Beit Sahour), about our Lord's Presentation into the Temple, which we celebrate on February 2nd, 40 days after His birth, and about the only story we have of Jesus when he was 12 years old. Besides His birth and this story, the rest of our Lord's earthly life as expressed in the 4 Gospels, begins when He is 30 years old and ends with His Passion, Death, Resurrection, 11 stories after He rose from the dead, and his Ascension into Heaven. Christ is in our Midst!

During this Advent period of our Orthodox Faith, we are called to focus on our words, deeds, and thoughts. We prepare, in joyful anticipation, for the Greatest Gift of all ... the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. During this time of year, we all reflect on the blessings we have received and are thankful to God that He has blessed us according to His endless grace, mercy, and love. As the Order of Saint Ignatius of Antioch Governing Council, we are thankful for all of you that selflessly and unconditionally give to support the ministry of the Order of Saint Ignatius of Antioch. You help us change the lives of countless people we will never come to know personally.

For almost 50 years, you, and those before you made a conscious decision to put the needs of others ahead of your own. During the uncertainty and fear of a global pandemic, The Order prepared for an estimated 25% to 30% reduction in member gifts during 2020 and 2021. However, your gifts during that time represented a "True Act of Faith" and The Order realized less than a 3% fall in member gifts. Because of you, children were able to attend camp throughout North America. Retired clergy and their wives continued to receive the financial assistance they depend on during their golden years. Mission parishes throughout North America, were able to worship and share the Orthodox Faith. Our youth were able to remain connected and provide love and support for one another even without being in each other's physical presence. Your "Act of Faith" made this possible.

For the past 5 fiscal years from 2017 through 2021, the impact of your gift to the Order has been felt by countless people and in many ways. During that time, \$1,456,173 was given to support our active and retired clergy as well as married seminarians. You helped provide \$1,607,562 for the youth of the Antiochian Archdiocese (including camp scholarships which were reduced in 2020 and 2021 due to fewer campers for safety protocols). \$1,253,691 was provided to support programs and departments for the development & growth of the Antiochian Archdiocese. You also helped give \$301,140 toward various outreach organizations. The annual financial commitments of The Order have always been and will always be strictly-focused on the long-standing needs of the Antiochian Orthodox Christian Archdiocese as well as grant-eligible organizations based on guidelines and by-laws of the Governing Council and for no other purpose. We are also thankful to share that only 7.7% and 7.2% of total income went to administrative expense in FY 2021 and the past 5 fiscal years respectively.




