Welcome to St. George! Thank you for attending today's Divine Services. If you are a first-time visitor, please register your visit by completing the guest book located in the narthex. We would appreciate getting to meet you after liturgy, so feel free to join us during Coffee Fellowship! Every Sunday we remember the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The word *"Liturgy"* means *work of the people* that means everyone participates through singing, praying, hearing the teaching, and opening our hearts to allow God's grace to enter. Anyone interested in learning more about our faith are encouraged to speak with one of our clergy.

Guidelines for Receiving Holy Communion for Orthodox Christians: Orthodox Christians fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist by receiving Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's command *to eat His Body and drink His Blood*. In order to be properly prepared to receive Holy Communion, the faithful should fast (no food or drink from midnight the night before), the Sacrament of Confession (7 years and older) within the last 2 months, being at peace with others, and striving to always love God and their neighbor. Frequent communion and regular confession are recommended for all faithful Orthodox Christians.

For other Christians: We welcome you to this celebration of the Divine Liturgy. Unfortunately, we cannot extend to you a general invitation to receive Holy Communion. Orthodox Christians believe that the Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of our community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, but for which we must all pray. All, however, are welcome to partake of the blessed bread (*antidoron*) which will be given when coming forward to venerate (kiss) the Holy Cross and receive the final blessing from the priest. Again, welcome!

Everyone should make a confession at least once during the Fast. Plan ahead and do not wait until the 11th hour!!! If you do not do so on a regular basis, confessions are heard on Saturdays after Great Vespers, before or after most services during the Great Fast, or Sunday after Coffee Fellowship. Confessions will not be heard on Sunday mornings during Matins until Fr. Joe returns.

GREAT AND HOLY WEEK EXCUSE LETTER Most of our K-12 and college students have had their "spring vacation" already; many revolving around the Western celebration of Pascha. For us, the Great and Holy Week begins on the evening of Palm Sunday, April 28th, and goes to the morning of Great and Holy Saturday, May 4th. 
Fasting Discipline The Great Fast began on, Monday, March 18th, and continues until our celebration



The journey to Heaven is never easy. Time spent in prison is a struggle, the time on parole is a struggle, the time after parole is a struggle. In fact, the journey of every Christian, in

every circumstance, in every age is a struggle. But the struggle, the journey, is joyful when done for Christ, for then it is filled with virtue, and the person on the journey, struggling alongside Christ, is trained in virtuous living.

I know a young man, now serving a 10-year parole.

At first, he lived in a shelter run by a small church, then a shared apartment. He worked long hours for low pay as a cook in fast food, but he never complained. He thought of and helped others. Sometimes his love for others, through poor choices, got him into parole trouble. But each step in his journey was a step forward. A few years down the road now, he has a good job and has just moved into his own home. Although he has not yet been able to join a church community; he has been able to receive Confession and spiritual counseling. He is patient and accepting of his circumstances. He is still on parole, still meeting with a counselor, still on a journey. His eyes are set on Christ, giving thanks to God every day, thankful for the struggle. And I give thanks every day for the inspiration he gives to me, for I too am still on a journey.
