Welcome to St. George! Every Sunday we remember the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The word "Liturgy" means work of the people which means everyone participates through singing, praying, hearing the teaching, and opening our hearts to allow God's grace to enter. For those who have committed themselves to the Orthodox Faith (through Baptism and/or Chrismation) it also means, if prepared, the reception of Holy Communion. Preparation includes the Sacrament of Confession (7 years and older) within the last 2 months, prayer, being on time for church, being at peace with others, attending the Divine Liturgy regularly, and fasting (no food or drink from midnight the night before). If you are new, just visiting, or have any questions, please introduce yourself to Father Joe. Please know that everyone is invited to venerate the Holy Cross and receive Holy Bread at the end of Liturgy. All are welcome to our Coffee Fellowship in the hall after Liturgy.

In the **Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom**, we sing the following special hymns,

<u>First Antiphon</u> - **Psalm 111**

- Verse 1. I will give thanks to Thee, O Lord, with my whole heart; I will make all Thy wonders known. *Refrain: Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.*
- Verse 2. In the company of the upright, in the congregation, great are the works of the Lord. Refrain
- Verse 3. They are studied by all who have pleasure in them. Refrain
- Verse 4. His work is glory and beauty, and His righteousness endures forever. *Refrain* Glory to the Father ..., now and ever Amen. *Refrain*

Second Antiphon - Psalm 112

- Verse 1. Blessed is the man who fears the Lord, who greatly delights in His commandments.
 - Refrain: O Son of God who was born of the Virgin, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia.
- Verse 2. His descendants will be mighty in the land, the generation of the upright will be blessed. Refrain
- Verse 3. Glory and wealth are in His house, and His righteousness endures forever. Refrain
- Verse 4. Light rises in the darkness for the upright, the Lord is merciful, compassionate, and righteous. *Refrain*

St. Joseph the Betrothed and James the Brother of God

Saint Joseph the Betrothed was of the lineage of King David. In his first marriage, he had four sons and two daughters. After he became a widower, St Joseph led a life of strict temperance. He was chosen to be the husband and guardian of the Most Holy Theotokos, who had taken a vow of virginity.


An angel told him of the Incarnation of the Son of God through her. St Joseph was present when the shepherds and the Magi worshiped the new-born divine Infant. On the orders of the angel, he fled into Egypt with the Mother of God and the newborn, saving them from the wrath of King Herod. He lived in Egypt with the Virgin Mary and the divine Child, working as a carpenter. St Joseph died at the age of one hundred.

St Joseph is commemorated on the Sunday after the Nativity. If there is no Sunday between December 25 and January 1, his Feast is moved to December 26. The Righteous Joseph is also commemorated on the Sunday of the Holy Forefathers.

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The Holy Apostle James, Brother of the Lord, was the eldest son of Joseph the Betrothed from his first marriage with Solomonia. The Apostle James is remembered after the Feast of the Nativity of Christ together with his father Joseph and the Prophet-King David, since he accompanied his family on the Flight into Egypt and lived there with the Infant Jesus, the Mother of God and Joseph. Later, he returned to Israel with them.

After the Ascension of the Lord, St James was the first Bishop of Jerusalem, gaining the great esteem not only of Christians, but also of Jews. He was thrown from the roof of the Jerusalem Temple because he had publicly preached to the people about the God-manhood of the Lord Jesus Christ. The Holy Apostle James is also commemorated on October 23.

Therefore, let us remember those Christians who endure persecution because of their faith in Christ the Incarnate God, and include in our prayers the imprisoned Archbishop Jovan of Ohrid, the abducted hierarchs, Metropolitan Boulos Yazigi and Archbishop Yohanna Ibrahim, both of Aleppo, and the abducted nuns and orphans of the Saint Thekla Monastery in Maaloula, Syria.

On blessed and holy Feasts of the Nativity and Theophany, we offer to each of you our best wishes for a joyful season of worship and fellowship. May your hearts be filled with assurance, joy and hope, and may the peace and mercy of our Lord be with you in the New Year.
