Welcome to St. George! Thank you for attending today's Divine Liturgy. Please register your visit by completing the guest book located in the narthex. We would appreciate getting to meet you, so feel free to join us during Coffee Fellowship in our Banquet Center!

Every Sunday we remember the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The word "*Liturgy*" means *work of the people* that means everyone participates through singing, praying, hearing the teaching, and opening our hearts to allow God's grace to enter. We believe Holy Communion to be a sign that in Christ we have all things in common, share an identical faith, and are united fully to the Orthodox Church. Anyone interested in learning more about our faith are encouraged to speak with one of our clergy. Holy Communion can be given to Orthodox Christians who have prepared themselves through prayer, fasting (no food or drink from midnight the night before), the Sacrament of Confession (7 years and older) within the last 2 months, being at peace with others, and attending the Divine Liturgy regularly. Please know everyone is invited to venerate the Holy Cross and receive Holy Bread at the end of Liturgy.

In the **Divine Liturgy** of **St. John Chrysostom**, we sing the following **Special Hymns**:

First Antiphon – Verses from Psalms 131, 86, and 45

Verse 1. Lord, remember David and all his meekness.

Refrain: Through the prayers of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

Verse 2. Lo, we heard of it at Ephrathah: we found it in the fields of the wood. *Refrain*

Verse 3. Glorious things are spoken of Thee, O city of God. *Refrain*

Verse 4. God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved: God shall help her early in the morning.

Refrain Glory to the Father ... , now and ever Amen. *Refrain*

Second Antiphon - Verses from Psalm 131

Verse 1. The Lord hath sworn in truth unto David; and He will not turn from it.

Refrain: O Son of God who arose from the dead, save us who sing to Thee, Alleluia.

Verse 2. Of the fruit of your body will I set upon your throne. *Refrain*

Verse 3. There will I make the horn of David to grow: I have prepared a lamp for My Anointed.

Verse 4. For the Lord has chosen Zion: He has desired it for His dwelling place. *Refrain*

SEPTEMBER 9TH ~ JOACHIM AND ANNA, PARENTS OF THE VIRGIN MARY

Saint Anna lived with her husband Saint Joachim in Nazareth of Galilee. They were childless into their old age and all their life they grieved over this. They had to endure derision and scorn, since at that time childlessness was considered a disgrace. They never grumbled, but fervently prayed to God, humbly trusting in Him. The prayer of the saintly couple was heard. An angel told them a daughter would be born to them, Who would be blessed above all other women. He also told them that She would remain a virgin, would be dedicated to the Lord and live in the Temple, and would give birth to the Savior. Obeying the instructions of the heavenly messenger, Saints Joachim and Anna met at the Golden Gate in Jerusalem. Then, as God promised, a daughter was born to them and they named her Mary. Saint Joachim died a few years later at the age of 80, after his daughter went to live in the Temple. Saint Anna died at the age of 70, two years after her husband.

Saints Joachim and Anna are often invoked by couples trying to have children.
